### **Chairman's Report**

30th April 2025

#### Welcome

As everyone will now be aware, Gary Pontifex, our Vice Chair, has been involved in a serious accident while riding through the Fergusson Valley. The road had a lot of curves, and due to vehicles cutting corners, gravel had been sprayed onto the road. Gary experienced a front wheel slide on a left hand bend which moved him into the right lane. While trying to avoid an oncoming car, he went down a one metre embankment and into a farmer's fence.

Fortunately, Gary had some very capable riders following him. The closest to him put Gary into a recovery position and helped stabilise him until an ambulance arrived. Another rider thoroughly documented the scene, taking photographs, GPS coordinates and talking to the farmer whose fence was now damaged. The farmer stated that he had approached the local council about the previous seven accidents on that corner, however no action has yet been taken.

I wish Gary a speedy recovery from his injuries, the beloved Indian however is a write off.
